COLUMBIA COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS 2021

Bill Dunlavy Memorial Scholarship - \$1,000

Zoe Kelly—Zoe is a 28 year-old woman with 81.5 units completed a CC, enrolled in 14 more currently. 4.0 GPA and works as a teacher for Head Start program in Jackson and also involved in leadership on campus as a peer mentor through TRIOS SSS at Columbia College. She has been on the President's List academically for all semesters at CC. She has more than the usual praise from two CC instructors. Her math instructor describes her as "an amazing student, totally engaged, always attentive." Her Child Development instructor called her "one of the best students I have ever had" and said, "I use her work as an example to other students."

Harvey "Dusty" Rhodes Scholarship - \$600

Rozlyn Robinson—A 59-year-old woman returning to school at age 42 after being diagnosed with MS. Overcame this setback with lots of grit and positivity. She plans to get her AA degree and then transfer to UC Davis for her Bachelor's degree, followed by her Master's in psychology. She has done lots of volunteer work and has shown major determination to get to where she is. Her references were great, and her GPA is 3.86. We believe she is a great candidate to receive this year's Harvey "Dusty" Rhodes Scholarship.

Felix Romo Memorial Scholarship - \$600

Kaitlin Southard—A 26-year-old female with a strong drive to keep moving towards her goals. Her dream is to bring stories to life as a graphic artist, character designer, concept artist, or cartoonist. Her interests are very eclectic, providing her with a quite different perspective. She is innovative and sees opportunities where others may not. Her GPA is 3.75 and has a noticeably clear idea of where she wants to go in life. She works hard to achieve what she sets out to do. Her references are particularly good. We feel she was the best fit with the most need for the Felix Romo Memorial Scholarship.

Judge Ross A. Carkeet, Sr. Memorial Scholarship - \$800

Chance Tillery—A 19-year-old male with a desire to keep learning and to pass on that knowledge and experience to his students someday. He has always felt at home in the school environment but struggled with socializing and making friends. With a lot of self-searching, he realized he did not want to just do well in school, but he wanted friends, to make memories, and try new things. Thanks to a critical instructor, he was shown a different approach to history that ignited his curiosity and he started thinking about things in a different way. He is creative and insightful and had professional instincts. He plans to continue his education in a 4-year college to continue to grow academically and personally, and eventually to become a History or ESL teacher. Chance has participated in numerous school plays and enjoys playing the piano.

Les Coon Memorial Scholarship - \$800

Jasmine Buslett—A 29-year-old female single parent of two children. She is a Health Major and has received awards for outstanding work in both Chemistry and Biology, as well as made the Presidents List in Scholastic Honors. Her GPA is 4.0 and her goal is to earn her AS in Nursing and then transfer to Stanislaus State to obtain her Bachelor's in Nursing, then on to getting her Master's to become a Nurse Practitioner. Her financial need is great. Her references are superb, and she would be an excellent candidate for this scholarship.

Vernon McDonald Memorial Scholarship - \$800

Derek Allison—A 29-year-old male, married with 2 children. He served 4 years in the US Army as an airborne combat medic with an honorable discharge in 2019 after being injured. He was deployed in Italy during service time. He has had 53 units at CC going back to 2010, prior to his military service. Cumulative GPA of 3.81. No listed involvement in leadership or community service. Aspires to obtain a degree (BS) in neurology. His 2 references are an Army medic he served with in Italy and a medical doctor that he worked under in Italy. Medic describes him as "hard working, intelligent" who "always made the care of his soldiers his top priority." The physician describes him as "resilient, trustworthy" with a "strong work ethic and always eager to take on a challenge." Both highly recommend him for the scholarship.

DISTRICT 4-A1 STUDENT SPEAKERS CONTEST WINNER




