

Mother Lode Food Project (Green Bags) - December 2021



The totals are in for the Mother Lode Food Project. Their donations increased by a whopping 20% from October, which is excellent news for our community. This makes FIVE consecutive deliveries in 2021 of over 1,000 pounds of food. The total poundage of food donated for the year 2021 is 7,722 pounds! This month, the Sonora Lions club donated 65 pounds (6 bags) of donated food items for a monetary value of \$120. The next collection date for the Mother Lode Food Project our club is Wednesday, February 16th, for distribution to ATCAA between February 22-24th. Please dig deep and give to those less fortunate.

Also, we'd like to mention: ATCAA has asked that we not include items packaged in glass containers. Please try to find your items either in canned form or in plastic containers. There is so much breakage and it is a shame to have any amount of food wasted just because of that.

We thank you for all you do to help keep our community safe and healthy.

Spot Vision Program

We are going to try to bring the Sonora Lions Club back into the district's Spot Vision Program. PDG Tom and I have volunteered to chair this valuable program and contact the elementary schools in our area to see how we can help protect the children by detecting any eye problems a child may be experiencing. It has been proven that the younger a subject is when an issue is detected and addressed, the better chance that he/she may have in overcoming it and having it corrected. We would like to know if you are interested in helping us on this program. We are looking for 3-4 members to accompany us on our school visitations to help screen the students and process the screening information. If you were at the meeting on the first of December, Past District Governor Don Allen gave a short explanation of the program and how it works. The process is quite simple and really does not take long to do.

Once we have permission from the school to perform this service, we will get the necessary information from the school about the students, enter that information on a memory card designed for use in the camera, then perform the eye exams on the students. Once the exam is performed, the results can be uploaded onto that card, and a paper copy of the result can be printed for the school's use if needed. The club does not maintain or keep any information on any of the students ever. If pictures are taken during these screenings, permission is required before using any images of any persons appearing in the pictures. We never have direct physical contact with the student and actually, our exposure to them is very minimal.



We will, of course, follow any restrictions the school may require, such as mask wearing. We last did a screening at a pre-school in the Lake Don Pedro area about 4 years ago, and I believe it is time we get back in the swing of things and start helping our schools and children. Please let either PDG Tom or me know if you would like to participate in this program. It is very easy to do and rewarding to witness.
